
State Revenue Roller Coaster

General Fund "Big 3" Tax Revenues (In Billions)



2014-15: A Case in Point

Revenues Up \$5.9 Billion (June 2014 to May 2015)

• Proposition 98 up \$5.4 billion.

> If Revenues Grow Further (Up to \$1.3 Billion)

• All goes to Proposition 98.





May Revision: University of California Proposal

- No Tuition Increases for 2015-16 and 2016-17
- > \$96 Million for Retirement (With Conditions)
- **Extension of Multiyear Plan to 2018-19**
- UC Agrees to Implement Various Operational Changes

May Revision: California State University

>Additional \$38 Million Base Augmentation

Governor's Intention That Funds Go to:

- Improve student success.
- Fund 1,500 additional transfer students.

Overall Budget

> Higher May Revision Revenues (\$7 Billion) Go to:

 Proposition 98: 	\$5.5 billion
 Proposition 2: 	\$1.3 billion

• Earned Income Tax Credit proposal: \$0.4 billion

Revenues Could Be Even Higher

LAO Projecting 2015-16 Revenues to Be \$3.1 Billion Higher

- Two-thirds goes to Propositions 98 and 2.
- One-third available for discretionary purposes.

Overall Approach Sound

K-12 Ongoing Funds to Local Control Funding Formula

One-Time Monies to Pay Off Large Remaining Mandate Obligations

• We suggest different allocation method.

Special Education

Governor Proposed \$60 Million Package, Based on Recent Task Force Report

Many Provisions Have Merit, but Proposal Comes Late in Process

Recommend \$150 Million Toward Equalization

Adult Education

Many of May Revision Changes Are Significant Improvements

> LAO Remaining Concerns:

- "Locking in" funding levels for individual provider.
- Absence of key statewide policies related to assessment, accountability, and fees.

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
